IB STUDENTS GET REGISTERED FOR MAY 2014 TESTING

A total of 176 students were registered for IB testing before the first registration deadline of Nov.15. It is hoped that all students registered, which will help minimize costs for SBCSC. Readers may be interested to know that the cost of each student registration is \$157 and each test taken costs \$108. We are extremely grateful to the South Bend Community School Corporation for its continued support of our program which is recognized as the most rigorous academic program in the city. As noted by Aiden Reilly in the recently published JAHS *Tower* newsletter, the IB program has helped us in "establishing a firm grip on the title for best academic school." Of the students who registered for 2014 tests, a total of 29 students are IB Diploma candidates who are on schedule to complete the prestigious IB Diploma in May. Another 36 juniors are on track for a 2015 Diploma as "Anticipated" graduates and most will test in only one subject in May, leaving the remainder of tests for the senior year. We wish everyone much success as you continue into the Spring and complete the last few months of studies.

- Claudia Taccheri A Study of the Possible Role of Long-Term Ingestion of Coenzyme Q10 on Cognitive Process





JUNIOR IB STUDENTS ATTEND THE IB EXPERIENCE CONFERENCE

On November 1, a group of 14 students along with Mrs. Woodward (IB Visual Arts) and Dr. Mika headed to the University of Indianapolis for the annual student-led conference for IB students. An excellent conference was hosted by the university and included informational sessions with plenty to learn. Students learned about the IB Program, the required TOK, CAS, Extended Essay components, along with topics such as university admissions processes for American colleges and universities, as well as the acceptance and ease of applying to schools in the United Kingdom. The IB is a world renown program, and all students were encouraged to consider applying for schools in Canada and Europe. In many of these schools, entrance requirements are much easier to complete, and the Bachelor's degree is only a three year program (UK & Canada) rather than the four year program that we are accustomed to here in the United States. Upon return to South Bend, many students expressed interest in getting involved and participating in next year's conference by presenting some insights that many others will be interested in learning about. Participation in such events and conferences is highly encouraged by teachers and students alike.



TEDX JOHN ADAMS HIGH SCHOOL IS A BIG SUCCESS!

Nearly all of the one hundred registered guests attended the first-ever TEDxJohnAdamsHighSchool talk in the school auditorium on Friday, December 13. Visitors to the event came from as far away as Elkhart, Indiana to listen to three invited speakers who shared their views and research results on topics such as adolescent student leadership roles by Dr. Kelly Jordan (Holy Cross College), adolescentability and how students often learn more outside of our schools than within them by Dr. Susan Blum (Notre Dame), and sharing a "penny for your thoughts" in which relationships, identity, and perceptions matter by Dr. David Moss (SBCSC). Organized by IB Seniors Raymond Han and Abigail Brockman, the event also included previously recorded TED talks by well-known speakers including Daniel Tammet and Malcolm Gladwell. The center stage layout including a very smart TEDx sign, while to the right a wonderful backdrop with a window, fireplace, table, and books were suspended in the air. All these props were prepared by several students under the direction of theatre director Tony Moranda – all of whom were recognized at the conclusion of the event by stepping onto the stage to strong applause from an appreciative audience. The speakers stood left of the screen while using a large center screen to show various powerpoint slides and video clips. Filming and audio of the talks were coordinated by Vinny Bilancio and Jeff Kroger, and it is hoped that in several months, the talks may be posted on the TED website. Because of the careful preparations ahead of time, the event went off very well, and numerous comments heard from the audience at the conclusion of the event were very encouraging. A comment by Junior IB student Sarah Bowling nicely captures this feeling - "I loved the event. It raised many ethical perspectives and it did it though members of our own community. It opened up ways for us, as individuals, to change our perspectives of the world." It is believed that this was the first-ever TEDx event among area high schools, and the hopes are high that this is a start for something that students will consider organizing once again next year.


UPCOMING ADAMS HIGH SCHOOL ART SHOW AT IUSB
