#### THE STATE OF ADAMS IB - SPRING 2014

This has been a record setting year! I can simply state that "the state of the Adams IB" is perhaps healthier and stronger than it has ever been in the past. We are moving forward and upwards with great students, solid encouragement and guidance from the teachers, and fantastic parental involvement and support. It is a pleasure to review with you the highlights from this year and share some of the plans for the future. I thank everyone who is involved in the IB Program in our school. You are awesome!

The IB Program has attracted more Diploma students than in years past, and this year a total of 27 Diploma candidates are hoping to receive their Diplomas in July when grades are released by the International Baccalaureate Organization. The number of candidates sets a record for the program, and we expect the number of graduates also to exceed all previous accomplishments. With IB Certificate students added, a total of 179 students registered for testing this year, which is a record for the school.

The IB Steering Committee, under the guidance of Dr. Kelly Jordan engaged the IB teachers in a self-assessment study this spring that helped lead to a dialogue between the committee and Superintendent Dr. Schmidt. A very productive meeting at the end of May promises to lead to

some concrete results; namely changing the textbook adoption procedures for IB courses; allocation of needed resources for continued IB teacher training; and limits to student enrollment numbers. The guidance and support of the Steering Committee should be greatly appreciated by all in our school as well as the families of our students. The committee will, in fact, work through the summer to take advantage of the momentum gained as Dr. Schmidt welcomes the input of the committee members. As if in concert with the concerns voiced by the Committee above, support for the training of IB teachers has reached a new high, as the school corporation will enable a total of eight teachers (to date) to receive the much coveted training for various subject areas in the coming summer and fall. Among the teachers are some newcomers to IB, namely Dan Walsh (Physics), Mark Wilson (Chemistry), Dawn Worsham & Amanda Zablocki (Visual Arts), Sally Troxel (Biology), and James Elrod (English). We look forward to working with you!

Of the many special events we had in school this year, perhaps the most talked about was the visit of our Amish guests from Shipshewana. While many people were skeptical and nervous about this visit, the results were fantastic and everyone was happy for being involved on this day of cultural exchange. We can only hope to continue this interaction in years to come.

So what will next year bring? A total of 233 incoming Magnet Freshmen students have registered and have been scheduled to begin classes next Fall. We also anticipate a total of 46 Diploma candidates to continue through the TOK course and complete the Diploma. A total of 72 rising Juniors have signed up to take the TOK course in Spring 2015, which will ensure another large pool of IB Diploma candidates. Summer 2015 will offer a travel opportunities to China; Junior IB students can attend and

participate in the IB Student Experience conference; and other events of interest are bound to come up for everyone. Finally, much is owed to our Principal Mrs. Reese who has been supportive of the IB Program during her tenure as school Principal. Without her guidance and continued support, we would not be where we are today. Our sincere thanks to her for all she has done. With her retirement this year, we await the appointment of the new Principal as life continues at Adams. It will be an interesting year ahead, but before we get there, I wish everyone a great summer and well deserved break! Dr. Mika

# GRADE 10 MAGNET STUDENT AIDEN REILLY REPRESENTS INDIANA IN THE NATIONAL STOCKHOLM JUNIOR WATER PRIZE COMPETITION

No country on Earth values their water supply more than Sweden. Their interest in an adequate, clean source of water extends beyond their country to the remainder of Earth and as such, they support science investigations focused on drought/flooding, ground water issues, salinization, pharmaceutical problems related to water sanitation and hygiene.

For 17 years, Stockholm Junior Water Prize has congregated the world's imaginative young minds for outstanding competition in the capital of Sweden. encouraging their continued interest in water and sustainability. Each year, thousands of participants in over 30 countries all around the globe join national competitions in hopes of earning the chance to represent their country. The winner of the Stockholm Junior Water Prize receives \$15,000 along with an all expense paid one-week trip to Sweden. Of the submitted entries from Indiana, Aiden's research paper was selected as the single best paper to represent our state at the National Competition in Reston, VA on June 12-15, 2014.

Aiden's work has focused on improving the efficiency of removing ground water pollution by a unique process called bioremediation. In brief, the process involves enhancing the oxidation processes in specific bacteria, which are found naturally in the soil, to remove soil water contaminants. Given the fact there are twelve Superfund sites within a fifteen-mile radius of John Adams High School, this is an especially timely topic. Aiden has focused on this area of study for more than eight months and expects to continue his work during the next school year. Following the excitement of this experiment, he has indicated an interest in pursuing water studies as a career. Further, he is well on his way to completing his investigation for the Extended Essay requirement of the IB Diploma. Indiana Water Environment Association organized Aiden's selection and provided the monetary funding of the trip. We congratulate Aiden on his accomplishment!

## 2011 IB PROGRAM RANKING HIGH IN STATE

So how does the Adams IB program compare to other schools in the state? This is a question many families have asked, and for teachers and everyone interested in the IB program - including the IB Steering Committee that discovered this uplifting information - many will be surprised to learn that according to 2011 Indiana Department of Education sources, the IB Program at JAHS ranked high in comparison to all other high schools in the state. Data shows that we ranked second in the state for public high schools with 17.5% of all graduating seniors who passed IB tests. Only one other public school - Goshen High School - ranked higher with 23.2% of graduates in this category. A few private schools ranked higher, led by the International School of Indiana with 100% success, followed by Signature School in Evansville with 85.2%, and Guerin Catholic High School in Noblesville with 64.6%. John Adams ranked 5<sup>th</sup> in the state! In addition, we ranked third in the number of graduates who took IB tests, with 70 students, behind Goshen HS (81) and Guerin HS (79). To all teachers who work tirelessly to educate our students, this is some good news that we can all be proud of. We wait for more recent data to show us how things have developed in the last few years.
