

IB STUDENTS RECEIVE SCIENCE RESEARCH FUNDING

Following a fifty-year pattern of success, eight JAHS juniors recently learned that their research proposals had been fully funded by the American Association for the Advancement of Science. This national organization funds professional scientists' work and provides support for a limited number of high school investigations. Most of the students' investigations continue last year's progress in the Adams Science Research Program. In addition, the students' work will satisfy the Extended Essay requirement for the IB program. Currently, twenty-five other students are working on their Extended Essays through the Science Research Program.

Students who were funded in their topic titles include: Chloe Sherry, Effect of Light-Shock Conditioning on Neurotransmitter Concentrations in Planarian Flatworms; Madeline Doctor, Improving Electrode Kinetics and Operational Lifetime of a Prototype Membrane-less Glucose-Oxygen Physiological Fuel Cell; Stephen Bauer, Using Ultra-Capacitors to Increase the Efficiency and Power Output of the Direct Methanol Fuel Cell; Caleb Geissler, A Study of the Effect of Utilizing Heat Generated from Computer Processing, Supplemental Phosphate, and Supplemental Nitrate to Enhance Hydrogen Gas Production in Heterocystous, Filamentous Cyanobacteria Anabaena cylindrical; Adam Staszewski, Identifying Pollen Cells Using Computer Analysis: An Aid for Allergists, Immunologists, and Other Health Care Specialists; Elinor Thomas, Study on the Properties of Electromagnetic Fields and their Possible Effects on Biological Materials and the Light-Shock Memory of Planarian Flatworms; Claudia Taccheri, The Effects of Ingestion of Coenzyme Q_{10} on Cognitive Process as administered with Cholesterol to Mimic Alzheimer's Disease; Nicole Gorman, Evaluating Possible Effects of Polystyrene Spheres on the Development of Brine Shrimp



JOHN ADAMS IB STUDENT SELECTED BY INTEL AND SIEMENS CORPORATIONS AS A TOP SCIENTIST

John Adams High School was recently informed that Raymond Han, an IB Diploma candidate, had been selected as a semifinalist by both the Siemens Corporation and by the Intel Corporation in their nationwide science competitions. Earlier Raymond was selected as the top high school science researcher in Indiana and presented the results of his fuel cell investigation at the National Convention of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) held in February 2013 in Boston, MA.

His investigation entitled *The Effects of Hydrophobicity and Microporous Layers in the Membrane Electrode Assembly of a Direct Methanol Fuel Cell to Enable Efficient Operation Using High Concentration Fuel* has continued over a three year period of time and constitutes the topic for his IB Extended Essay. Fuel cells are considered, by many experts, as the primary alternative energy source to replace our reliance on petroleum.

Most of his early exploratory work was focused on improving the fuel cell efficiency by modifying the flow of electrons through the electrodes. Raymond's investigations also centered on these electrodes which he modified with various catalysts plated on different metals as well as carbon nanotube fiber cloth. Congratulations Raymond!
