THE STATE OF THE IB PROGRAM A year of progress and change for Adams IB

This is the second "State of the Adams IB" that I have the pleasure of writing. I begin by thanking all teachers and administrators who have worked with me this past year and who have been a part of the expanding IB Program in our school.

Among the highlights was the adoption of a required IB Assessment Policy that will help direct our program and how we assess student accomplishment. Three new IB courses –Spanish Ab Initio, Cultural & Social Anthropology, as well as an online Math HL course have brought more choices for students. Most important for the continued development of the IB Program was the SBCSC decision to adopt a 7-period day.

Starting next fall, the core Diploma course Theory of Knowledge (TOK) will be taught in a regular period. A total of 38 students took the after-school course this past spring, and the course will be taught in two regular class sections next fall. In addition,

junior IB students visited Butler University for a student-led IB Conference this past fall and we expect another large group to take advantage of this opportunity in the coming year. Teacher training and conference participation improves skills with English & Physics teachers attending workshops at Rice University in Houston while three other teachers received online training in Math SL, Environmental Systems & Societies, and TOK.

So what can we expect for next year? A total

of 235 incoming Magnet Freshmen students have registered and are scheduled to begin classes next fall. A total of 78 Juniors will take the TOK course in spring 2014, ensuring another large pool of IB Diploma candidates. The German language course has done very well this past year, and hopes are that the German language will grow and eventually be offered at the IB level as well. We are working to ensure that more IB teacher training will be supported by SBCSC. Plans are also underway for Spring Break 2014 tours to Costa Rica and Montreal, and a summer 2015 tour to China. Finally, I thank Mrs. Cathy Hall for her continued work on the IB Intellect.

Research sends Adams IB student to Portland




Claire Rice, a junior IB student, recently learned that she has been selected to represent Indiana at the Stockholm Junior Water Prize Competition in Portland, Oregon during its June 12-15 conference. Claire's paper, "Possible Effects of Graphene Oxide Ingestion on Behavior and Physiological Processes in Daphnia magna and the Developmental Effects of Graphene Oxide on Triop Eggs," also represents the investigation she completed for her Extended Essay as an IB Diploma candidate. The Stockholm competition encourages young people to consider water and environmental issues in their career choice. State finalists will be considered for the International Competition to be held in Stockholm, Sweden in late December.

Adams IB student presents research in Boston

Junior IB student Raymond Han presented the results of his fuel cell investigation at the National Convention of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) in February in Boston. Raymond was selected in October 2012 in a competition sponsored by Indiana Academy of Science and organized by Indiana University Medical Center.

His investigation, "The Effects of Hydrophobicity and Microporous Layers in the Membrane Electrode Assembly of a Direct Methanol Fuel Cell to Enable Efficient Operation Using High Concentration Fuel," has continued over a two-year period and constitutes the topic for his IB Extended



Essay. The best high school research student from each state presented their findings in the Junior Division of the AAAS Convention. While in Boston, Raymond and the other state winners toured research laboratories at MIT, Harvard, and Boston General Hospital, along with visiting many historical sites.
